Seekers Award of Excellence

- 2. Earn at least ten Seekers recognition stickers.
- 3. Participate in at least one Drug Abuse Prevention Education lesson.

 - the Life Choices: A Character Game or
 - a presentation by a Community Role Model
- 5. Pick one of the topics found in the Citizenship Lessons and research a famous American who modeled the trait. Complete a report as outlined by the classroom teacher.

Champions Transition Award of Excellence- Medal (14212)

At the discretion of the teacher a student may be awarded the **Champions Transition Award of Excellence**. The primary requirement for this award is participation in the Champions Program. Additional requirements are set by the teacher. Suggested areas could include evaluation are attitude, participation and dedication.
